BATTLE OF FREDERICKSBURG, VA. DEC. 13TH 1862.—

This battle shows with what undaunted courage, the Lion-hearted Army of the Potomac always meets its foes. After forcing the passage of the Rappahannock on the 11th, in the face of a murderous fire from concealed Rebels; and taking possession of Fredericksburg on the 12th, on the morning of the 13th, it rushed with desperate valor on the intrenchments of the enemy, and thousands of its dead and dying, till night put an end to the carnage. Though driven back by an entrenched and hidden foe, the Soldiers of the North are still as ready to meet the Traitors of the South, as in their days of proudest victory.
